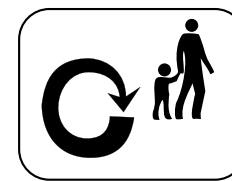
Welcome to Hillside...

Station to Station



Explore the wild nature of the Birkdale sandhills on a walk to Ainsdale Station (2 1/2 miles). There is a marked path all the way or find your own route along paths and tracks.

Circular Walks



It is possible to walk around the Royal Birkdale Golf Course on dune tracks and roads. In the dunes the waymarked paths will help you find your way.

Coastal Path



Hillside Station is the recommended finishing point for a 13 mile walk starting from Hall Road Station. It is possible to walk this route in either direction. A full guide to the route is available.
